SUBJECT:

For possible action: Consideration of Bill No. 2062, an ordinance of the City of Boulder City, Nevada repealing Boulder City Municipal Code Title 2, "Departments," Chapter 8 "Office of Emergency Management," and replacing it with a new Title 1, "Administration," Chapter 10 "Emergency Management" to update Boulder City's Emergency Management ordinance with current practice.

Business Impact Statement:

This action will not have a significant economic impact on business and will not directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business.

Action Requested:

That City Council consider the bill to repeal Title 2, "Departments," Chapter 8, "Office of Emergency Management," and replace it with Title 1, "Administration", Chapter 10 "Emergency Management".

Overview:

The enactment of this chapter is necessary to provide a framework for the development of a comprehensive emergency management plan to provide for the safety and welfare of the people and the protection of their property within the City in a natural or man-made disaster.

Background Information:

The current code currently falls under Title 2, Departments, and contains outdated language and terminology which is identified in the Emergency Operations Plan. The requested revision to Title 1, Chapter 10 would update the process for establishing emergency operations during a disaster to comport with current practice and updated definitions as provided for in Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS).

Emergency Council members will be appointed by the City Manager and will consist of department heads of each city department that may have key emergency responsibilities to the city government. In addition, the City's Emergency Operation's Plan would be developed and maintained by the emergency management council, with the plan approved by the City Manager.
