SUBJECT:

Presentation from Kim Lundgren, Chief Executive Officer of Kim Lundgren Associates, and Robert Burgy, Climate and Sustainability Program Manager of Clark County Department of Environment and Sustainability, regarding the All-In Community Sustainability and Climate Action Plan in Southern Nevada

Business Impact Statement:

This action will not have a significant economic impact on business and will not directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business.

Action Requested:

That the City Council receive the presentation and provide feedback as appropriate.

Overview:

- In January 2024, Boulder City formally joined the Interlocal Agreement establishing the All-In Regional Climate Collaborative, alongside Clark County, the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, the Southern Nevada Water Authority, and the Cities of Henderson, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, and Mesquite.
- The City Council will receive a presentation highlighting the progress and ongoing efforts of the All-In Regional Climate Collaborative, a regional partnership formed to address climate challenges and build long-term resilience throughout Southern Nevada.

Background Information:

The All-In Regional Climate Collaborative was established to foster a unified and regional approach to climate action planning in Southern Nevada. This initiative is designed to enhance collaboration among local and regional governmental entities, enabling them to align policies, implement coordinated climate strategies, and pursue funding opportunities both individually and collectively. With Southern Nevada facing significant environmental challenges such as prolonged drought, extreme heat, and rapid population growth, the need for a collaborative approach is both timely and essential.

By joining the Collaborative in January 2024, Boulder City became part of a broader coalition that includes Clark County, the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, the Southern Nevada Water Authority, and the cities of Henderson, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, and Mesquite. This partnership builds upon the foundational work of the All-In Clark County Sustainability and Climate Action Plan, which was developed through extensive community engagement and input from all participating jurisdictions.

The Collaborative aims to support member agencies by facilitating data sharing, aligning climate priorities, and coordinating public outreach, while still respecting the independence of each participating entity. Through this collective effort, Southern Nevada is better positioned to access federal climate funding and implement effective, region-wide solutions that promote long-term environmental, social, and economic resilience.
