2010	Inaugural HP Day on Saturday 05/01; Council announcement on Tuesday 04/27. HP Day was on a Saturday to be in conjunction with Spring Jamboree; some committee members staffed an information table for the public.
2011	HP Day on Sunday 05/01; Council announcement on Tuesday 04/26. HP Day again on a weekend to coincide with Spring Jamboree; there were weather issues and limited public interest. The inaugural HP Award was also presented at the Council meeting on 04/26.
2012	HP Day on Tuesday 05/08, the date of the Council meeting and presentation of HP Award.
2013	HP Day on Tuesday 05/14, the date of the Council meeting and presentation of HP Award.
	Restoration Workshop (first) held on Saturday 09/14 at the city's Smith Center building, featuring various classes for the public.
2014	HP Day on Saturday 05/10, in conjunction with the Committee's second Restoration Workshop; Council event announcement and presentation of the HP Award on Tuesday 04/22.
2015	HP Day on Tuesday 05/12, the date of the Council meeting and presentation of HP Award.
2016	HP Day on Saturday 05/14, in conjunction with the Committee's third Restoration Workshop, co-sponsored with Boulder City History & Arts Foundation; Council event announcement and presentation of the HP Award on Tuesday 05/10.
2017	HP Day on Saturday 05/13, in conjunction with the Committee's fourth Restoration Workshop (organized late, poor attendance); Council event announcement and presentation of the HP Award on Tuesday 05/09.
2018	HP Day on Saturday 05/12; event included speakers at the LADWP building and tours of the Six Companies Lodge; Council event announcement and presentation of the HP Award on Tuesday 05/08.
2019	HP Day on Saturday 05/11; "open house" event venues included LADWP building, Browder building, historic water filtration plant, BC High School, Bullock Field, Railroad Museum, Bureau of Reclamation and The Dillinger; Council event announcement and presentation of the HP Award on Tuesday 04/23.
2020	HP Day canceled due to COVID-19 (originally scheduled for 05/11); a "Virtual Historic Preservation Month" was designated for October instead, featuring four videos posted online for the presentation of the award and three other nominated properties; the award presentation occurred at the winning property.
2021	Due to the ongoing impact of COVID-19, no HP Day was chosen and the annual HP Award was the only planned event. Because the owner of the selected home was not willing to participate, the proposed video of the home did not occur; the award was announced at the 05/25 Council meeting (under public announcements).

2022	HP Day on Saturday 05/14; event venues included speakers at the Dam Roast House/Browder Bookstore, Boulder Dam Hotel, BC Company Store, Railroad Museum, historic water filtration plant and a panel discussion about the proposed new HP code and local grant programs at the LADWP building.

Call for Nominations for the 2022 Boulder City Historic Preservation Award

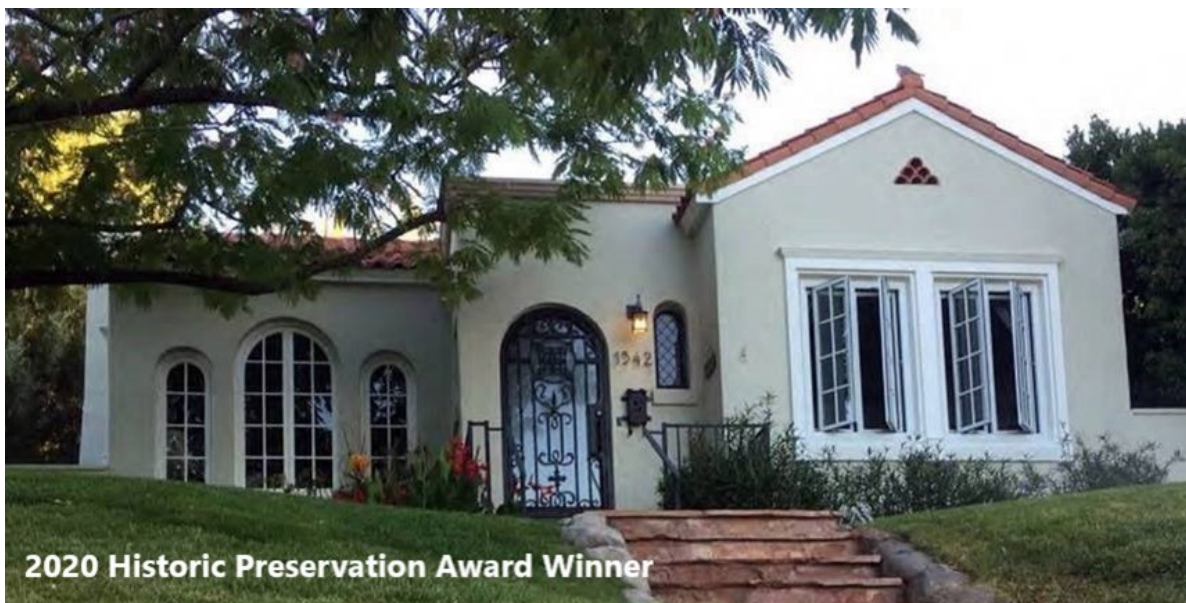

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee granted the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2021 to the Williams "Reclamation Employee House" at 507 Utah Street.

Located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the 507 Utah Street residence was selected for this award because:



- Of the 26 single-family employee residences constructed by the Bureau of Reclamation in 1932, the property at 507 Utah retains the most of its original architectural design and materials and remains a contributing resource of the Boulder City Historic District.
- The homeowner has taken great care to retain and preserve important character defining features such as the windows, front entry, and roof.
- Alterations to the home are minimal which helps maintain the historic integrity and character of the property, the Utah Street neighborhood, and the Historic District.

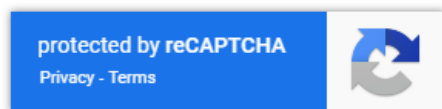
